

\*! Man, 35, found shot to death on East Dallas street A 35-year-old man who had been shot several times was found lying on an East Dallas street early Sunday. The man, whose name has not been released, was pronounced dead at 1:25 a.m. at Baylor University Medical Center. Police said the man collapsed in the 100 block of North Barry Ave. There were no witnesses to the shooting, police said.

Scholarship fund set up in memory of slain woman A scholarship fund has been established at Texas Woman's University in memory of Karen Harrison, a Dallas woman who was found shot to death in Brazoria County on Nov. 4. Ms. Harrison was an information specialist for a Dallas accounting firm and a graduate student at TWU. The fund has been set up in the School of Library and Information Studies. The money will be used to award scholarships to graduate students who are interested in careers in corporate libraries, TWU officials said. The \$2.3 million Red Bird Transit Center, built on 8.2 acres at Hampton **Road** and Marvin D. Love Freeway, is the first in Dallas. It replaces the Park-and-Ride lot that has been in operation since 1985 at Redbird Airport. The new center features 600 parking spaces and offers express bus service to downtown Dallas.
